LOWER SECONDARY SCHOOL BRATTVÅG UNGDOMSSKULE

This is a presentation of the lower secondary school in Brattvåg. Usually there are nine different classes, but this year there are only eight. There are 190 students, and 26 teachers.

These are the subjects: Maths, Norwegian, English, science, food and health, gym, geography, history, foreign language (German, French, Spanish), religion, social studies, arts and handcraft, music, advanced English or Norwegian.

They try to make the students read a lot of books.

In the first half of the first year they can try the different languages and before Christmas you have to choose which one you want to continue with.

There are three classrooms with computers that the students can use if they need. There they can learn excel, word, PowerPoint, etc.

After the three years at lower secondary school, the students must know the difference between the upper secondary schools so that they can choose what they want to do in the future.

The first year, some representatives from some local companies explain to the students the characteristics of their business. Then the students must do a presentation of the company to the representatives and the other students in their class. The students can work with the project for three days. And then they have to write a report of the project. This is because the companies want the students to come and work for them in the future. The companies are often sponsors to the schools. The first year the students also go for a visit to the upper secondary school.

The second year the students have to choose an education plan that they want to learn more about. They also have to work with an idea concerning a product in an entrepreneurial project. This year they also go for visits to some of the local companies.

The last year the students have to do a test about their interests and they have to have a conversation with career guidance experts. They will have to visit the university in Ålesund. They will also go to Haram upper secondary school for a week to check out the different lines. They can also choose to visit a different upper secondary school.

The students earn money to use for school trips

The students often enjoy the career guidance given by the school, the trips to the different schools and the visits to the companies.
